Madam, I beg to thank you for your kind letter of the 11<sup>th</sup> inst, and beg to say, in answer to your first question, that there would be no necessity to move the Cross or raise it.

Secondly, I could not give you a correct estimate of the cost, without seeing the design and character of the letters.

Thirdly, The cost of cutting the name dates &c, leaving out the Text, would depend on the number and character of the letters. If you would kindly send me the design I would give you every particular.

I beg also to add, that the man that I would send to do the work, thinks that he has cut letters drawn out by Mr Jell for Christ Church Britton for Professor Bressford Pike F.R.I.B.A.
